

The General Assembly (GA) was organized through Zoom due to covid-related restrictions. The five items below were presented by the direction team (DT), discussed whenever requested and finally approved.

1. The DT thanked Morgane Gibert (MG) for the considerable amount of work that she put in developing and designing the CAGT website. In addition to contribute to News and such section, each CAGT member is invited to develop his/her own webpage as long as (1) the overall structure in place is respected and (2) the underlying information and documents are provided to MG so she can implemented online posting. It is remembered that forthcoming publications are encouraged to be promoted through the CAGT website News section. Hence, it is requested to contact MG upon acceptance and provide her with a title, list of coauthors, possibly an abstract and a provisional date of publication so she has enough time to proceed with online posting. In case press releases are prepared, please remember that they may require further validation from either CNRS or University or both. Proceeding well ahead of publication is thus essential. The DT wishes that we get used to increasingly utilize INTRANET as this is common repository for a number of admin paperwork of interest for each and every CAGT members. A password will be reactivated on the 7<sup>th</sup> of each forthcoming month, and will be pinned in all CAGT buildings the last day of the ongoing month.
2. The DT provides an update on the many application successes obtained during the last few months, including 4 ANRs, 1 MITI CNRS project and 5 Marie-Curie post-doctoral positions. The rule that ANRs will contribute to the infrastructure budget up to 8% is recalled. This rule will be implemented when all projects will get started and following the lab council decisions wrt scientific policy. The DT recalls that PIs obtain funding for their own individual projects and have full authority to justify their own expenses with respect to their project' requirements. The DT presents the 'Dotation d'Etat' (DE) budget for the year, and describes the budget breakdown that is both (1) agreed by all group heads and (2) allows for infrastructure maintenance. The provisional budget for DE is uploaded on the CAGT intranet.
3. The DT provides an overview of CAGT new members, and those who will join us from Easter to the fall. This includes a total of 10 staff, at different stages of their individual careers (lab tech, postdoctoral researchers and PhD students).
4. The DT insists that each own of us complies with the procedures in place wrt hosting interns, especially Master students. Each supervisor will have to (1) anticipates where they will be located office-wise, and (2) identify the source of funding, in agreement with his/her group head, and then (3) send an email to the DT, cc'ing to Elisabeth Soulié and group head, providing both the first name, family name, starting date, ending date, contact details of the persons concerned. This is instrumental that this is done well ahead so as to prepare the necessary underlying paperwork.
5. Lab council elections were organized through a polling in zoom. They resulted in 100% of votes (out of 17 votants) supporting (1) Patrice Gérard as the representative of lab techs, engineers and admin staff, (2) Pablo Librado as the representative of post-doctoral members, (3) Marine Pouillet as the representative of PhD students, (4) Delphine Maret as the representative of Associate Profs and Profs, and (5) Morgane Gibert as the representative of researchers.
6. No further points were discussed during the 'open question' session.
